The brothers FH & W Lean were the original owner of Cornubia where, up to 1870 they had grown coffee. The forement blue book for 1872 records that the Lean Bros of Cornubia had a 10 hp steam sugar well in operation thus when the figure the Lean's first care planting with the year 1870. In 1874 however Hill & Co owned the Cornubia Central Estate, with which they were completely successful. By 1877 Leonard licutt was managing Cornubia, now crushing 42 tons downly, and at the seasons opening acutt was congretulated as "advancing the central factory system". In 1878 the plant consisted of a well, a 16 hp. engine and on 8 h.p. engine, 5 wetzels and 6 catrofogals
